We will be assigning points to the information for chapter evaluation for an overall prize or prizes to be determined. Each time a report is submitted, if it is a viable project, and it is completely filled out, 25 points are provided to the chapter, then incremental points are assigned based on the information and impact of the project and for the use of corporate sponsor products.

The items listed under each category are thought starters, not meant to be the total items, please add all that you used on additional sheets of paper.

1. **Location:** Provide the city, state and county of the project or closest landmark. If you have the GPS coordinates, Township/ Range/ Section, in addition to the general information above, that is great.

2. **Description of Project:** who, what, when, why (the goal) and how.

3. **Acres Impacted and Wildlife:** List the acres impacted (a guzzler may affect 640 acres). List all the wildlife the project will affect, game species, song birds, all the species. Photos of the before and after are perfect and should be planned for submission with this report.

4. **Total Funds Used:** All real cash used from all sources for the project, including grants. Total volunteer hours applied to the project, and the estimated value of those hours. If your state does not have a suggested hourly rate for farm or conservation work, the University of Missouri (extension.missouri.edu) provides a guide of custom rates for farm services which roughly applies to conservation projects, report G 302. For example, jobs using a tractor and loader have an hourly rate of \$47.50, digging holes \$25.50 an hour, fencing \$17.50 an hour, bush hogging \$15.00 per hour. Please check our web site at www.quwf.net, in the Tool Shed, in the Tool Box for updated state rate reports.

Also remember, if you spray hardwood stumps, a chemical application allowance would be included here. Remember photos.
